Country Neighbors 4-H Club Tours the MSU Meat Lab

On **February 10**, the **Country Neighbors 4-H Club** had the unique opportunity to tour the **MSU Meat Lab** — an experience that was both educational and eye-opening for youth and adults alike. A total of **26 youth and 14 adults** attended the tour, eager to learn about the meat processing industry and see firsthand how MSU supports education in agriculture and food science.

The facility left quite an impression on the group. The **MSU Meat Lab** processes **beef**, **hogs**, **and sheep** in its main area, with a separate dedicated space for **poultry processing**. One exciting new development is that the lab has begun supplying meat to a couple of cafeterias on campus, showcasing its growing impact.

Jennifer Dominguez, the lab's manager, guided the group through the tour and did an exceptional job explaining each step of the processing operation, as well as highlighting the lab's various capabilities. From the receiving area where the animals arrive, to the rooms where meat is cut, wrapped, and packaged, and even the massive commercial smokers, participants were able to explore the process from start to finish.

Highlights included:

- Touring the poultry processing area
- Visiting the animal intake and initial processing space
- Learning about cutting and packaging operations
- Standing inside one of the two industrial-sized smokers used for preparing meats

The Country Neighbors 4-H Club highly recommends a visit to the MSU Meat Lab for any 4-H group or individual interested in food science, animal processing, or simply expanding their agricultural knowledge. It was a valuable experience that connected classroom learning to real-world applications in an impressive and engaging way.

The commitment you put into "Making Your Best Better" is significant. Through your 4-H experiences you are molding your future by growing your skills, becoming a leader, and serving your community. Your 4-H journey has required curiosity, determination, accountability, and dedication to learning and growth. Your efforts are commendable and deserve to be recognized with a Michigan 4-H State Award, the highest honor bestowed on a 4-H member.

The Michigan 4-H State Awards Program is a hands-on learning experience that allows 4-H members to develop and practice "adulting" skills such as resume writing, filling out an application, and interviewing. Applications and interviews are based on communicating your 4-H participation and learning experiences. Applicants are eligible to compete for cash prizes and be recognized for their 4-H involvement. 4-H members who meet the minimum application score are eligible for a \$50 scholarship toward their 4-H Exploration Days registration. The 2025 Michigan 4-H State Awards will be presented during 4-H Exploration Days on June 18 at MSU.
