MSU Extension launches 2025 Global Voices Essay Contest with MSU Global Youth Advancement Network

The Global Voices Essay Contest offers a platform for young people around the world to advocate for their communities and share their opinions and stories about local and national challenges. Michigan students in grades 9-12, and young adults ages 18-24, are invited to share their own stories, reflections and visions by writing and submitting a 600-900-word essay focused on community (defined as the rich tapestry of cultures, experiences and ideas that shape our state). Sub-themes for the essay contest include shared natural resources, heritage and home, bridges of unity, innovation for the future and other.

A panel of MSU, MSU Extension, and Michigan 4-H judges will review and select the winning essays, which will be published on the MSU Global Youth Advancement Network website and receive cash prizes!

What's It All About?

About 1,000 youth (ages 12-19) and chaperones from across Michigan attend annually.

This fun MSU pre-college program could be the highlight of your summer - it could even change your life!

4-H Exploration Days registration goes from mid-March through April with session assignments made on a first-come, first-served basis. As you select your session choices, be sure to watch for age restrictions! Age requirements for sessions are based on your age as of January 1.

When registering youth will need to pay \$50. If requesting a scholarship, please wait to pay the remainder until scholarships discounts are applied to your balance. TANNER BUILDING EXHIBITS

All 4-H Clubs from Grand Traverse, Leelanau and Benzie County are welcome to create and exhibit a club booth display. Club booth displays should present the theme "There's No Place like 4-H to Build Success...in boots." Create an educational display, tell a story about your 4-H club members, show community service and project areas your club has participated in, etc. It is okay to use pictures and content from previous years! Booths will be awarded certificates such as most creative, best organized, and the top three winners will win VISA gift cards (1st=\$100; 2nd=\$75; 3rd=\$50), large ribbons, and a certificate.

Forms will be available via our website **March 3** to reserve a club booth space. Be prepared to set up your booth Thursday or Friday, July 31 and August 1, anytime from 12:00pm-9:00pm, or Saturday, August 2 from 9:00am-1:00pm in the Tanner Building. All independent projects and club booth displays must be complete by 1:00pm on August 3.

PAPER CLOVER FUNDRAISER

CLUB BEST PRACTICES

Each of our amazing Grand Traverse 4-H Clubs is led by volunteers who give incredible amounts of care, time, passion and skills to their leadership roles. Although some 4-H'ers wish their leaders will care for them through their entire 4-H experience, sometimes leaders need to transition into other life roles. Thank you all for your time, energy and talent. 4-H is for the youth, but it is impossible without YOU!

In the event the volunteer serving as primary administrative 4-H club leader needs to step down, the included form and checklist should be completed.

New since 2024, MSU has provided clear steps for leaders including ensuring the club has 2 Gold level volunteers ready to receive leadership responsibilities. When applicable, copies of Financial Manuals must be shared with the new leadership team and the new leadership profile must be added in 4HOnline. This tool will help to keep every Grand Traverse County 4-H Club strong and active. Please reach out to your 4-H Program Coordinator, Sarah Bye, with any questions you may have and if you are choosing to change the administrative leadership within your club. If you are planning to change club leaders, please fill out the attached Club Leadership Transition Checklist (See below).

Michigan 4-H Club Leadership Transition Checklist

In the event that the volunteer who serves as the primary administrative leader for a 4-H club needs to step down from that role and a different volunteer will assume that role, this form and checklist should be completed by the leaders involved and the local 4-H Program Coordinator.

As a reminder, every chartered 4-H entity must have at least 2 active gold level volunteers connected to it to remain active. If the club possesses a bank account, there must be 2 unrelated adult signatories on the account.

Confirm proposed volunteers are screened active gold volunteers in Volunteer Central
Staff person provides expectations to new administrative leader(s) for communication and reporting between club and 4-H office (i.e. annual financial, monthly bank statements, reenrollment processes, county awards, civil rights compliance, risk management, etc.)
Provide copies/electronic file/link of 4-H Financial Manuals (volunteer and treasurer) to new administrative volunteers. Document in Volunteer Central that these copies were provided.
Collect and review AFSR (September 1-current date) from outgoing administrative leader. Both volunteers and 4-H staff person review and confirm accurate balance at time of transition.
Club inventory transferred to new administrative leader (ex. flags, equipment, resources, decorations, charter documents/EIN letter, etc.)
Confirm the bank signatories changed to add new administrative leader. Resigned leader removed if resigning as a volunteer. At least 2 active gold volunteers are on the account as signatories. Bank may require club minutes documenting who has been approved to be added to the account. Bank may also require a copy of MSU determination letter.
Update County Financial Spreadsheet with new "Care of" point of contact for club (only 1 name accepted). If transition between September-October, update on County Financial Spreadsheet. If outside this time (November-August), email <u>4-H Financial inbox</u> with updated information.
 4-H Online New administrative leader profile add/change volunteer role; enroll and approve Club Profile—new administrative leader added, provide permissions to pull club roster reports. Be sure to provide guide: https://www.canr.msu.edu/od/planning_evaluation_and_reporting/4-h-online-support
County 4-H Club directory updated with new administrative volunteer contact information
Update county email distribution lists
Club member families notified of leadership change, contact information for new leader provided.
Thank outgoing volunteer for service—include in club transition email and a thank you note to leader.
