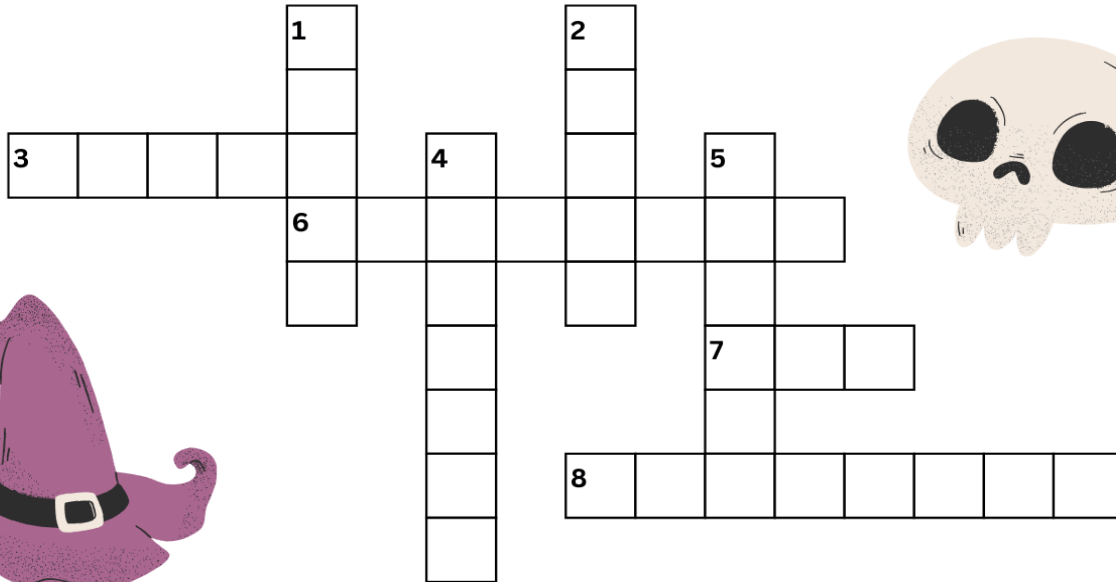




HALLOWEEN CROSSWORD

Call for Proposals: Breakout Workshop Sessions

The [Michigan 4-H Spectacular Youth Leadership Institute](#) is a lively celebration of the power of young people as leaders and agents of positive change. The Institute will be held December 6-8, 2024 in East Lansing, MI. The event is planned and led by youth and staff from Michigan 4-H.

In the spirit of “thinking globally and acting locally” youth (ages 13+) will participate in small and large group sessions during this exciting, energetic, and interactive conference where they will share and develop knowledge and skills related to youth leadership, community service, civic engagement, and global citizenship.

Proposals for 1 hour breakout sessions led by youth are sought by the planning committee. Proposals should be for sessions that are led, or co-led, by youth. Each breakout session will include approximately 10-20 youth participants. A 4-H staff member will be assigned to provide assistance to the youth leading (or co-leading) each breakout session. Breakout sessions may be scheduled for Saturday, December 7 or Sunday, December 8. Youth who submit a proposal which is accepted by the planning committee will be eligible to receive a discounted registration rate for the conference in return for their time and effort. The discounted registration rate (for up to 3 youth leading each breakout session) will be \$75 (a \$100 savings!).

Community volunteers and youth have always been the backbone of Michigan fairs and festivals. In addition to youth involved with fairs, there are a number of partners such as carnivals, concessionaires and entertainers that support the Michigan fair industry. Beyond the annual fair event, there are insurance providers, equipment providers and multitude of companies that provide support to fairs, festivals and exhibitions throughout the state. The Michigan Association of Fairs and Exhibitions (MAFE) is a member organizations of these fairs, festivals and industry partners founded in 1885.

MAFE is excited to announce that scholarships for youth involved with a MAFE member fair, festival or associate will be offered this year and presented at the annual convention banquet on Saturday, January 11, 2025, at the Amway Grand Plaza Hotel in Grand Rapids. Up to six \$1000 scholarships will be awarded based on an **application due November 2**. The MAFE scholarships are a coveted award with over 100 applicants annually. Applications are available on the MAFE website. The applications are reviewed by a committee of industry volunteers with winners notified in December.

"Supporting the next generation of fair leaders through scholarships and post-secondary education is vital to our industry's sustainability," shared Joh Schut, MAFE Executive Director. "In addition to leadership and growth opportunities at the annual convention, Michigan youth are also able to network with leaders in the fair and exhibition industry." MAFE was established in 1885 and is a voice for the Michigan Fair and festival industry. MAFE member fairs and festivals serve all 83 Michigan counties.

Michigan agricultural fairs are an economic and social asset to their communities and the state. They are the ultimate showcases of Michigan agriculture. Youth in attendance will become amateur zookeepers and discover firsthand what it takes to care for animals from around the world. Assist zoo staff behind the scenes and observe animal care sessions.

Youth in attendance will be living inside Busch Gardens. They will investigate the mysteries of the animal kingdom, getting up-close to animals they have never seen before. And in between life changing moments, participants will enjoy World Class Entertainment in our nation's fourth most popular amusement park.
