

Daily Details:

- ⇒ Each Wednesday* the instructor will lead the students on trails at the Bengel Wildlife Center to teach one unit from the BOSS Guidebook. There are 8 units - so don't worry if you miss a week... one extra week for makeup and games.
- ⇒ Daily routine: Arrive at 9 a.m. Students will begin at 9:15 as they head out for their unit/lesson. From 11:45—12:15 lunch at the Center with the instructor. 12:20—2:45 return to nature to complete their unit/lesson. Return to the Center at 2:45 and wait to be picked up at 3:00 p.m.
- ⇒ Student to bring a sack lunch each day. A bottled water will be provided.
- *Classes have a maximum capacity of 15 students. If the Wednesday class fills up, a Tuesday class will be offered

Michigan 4-H and FFA State Livestock Judging Contest moves to a new date!

The Michigan 4-H and FFAState Livestock Judging Contest is returning this year at a new date! Participants can demonstrate their livestock evaluation and selection skills, as well as improve their communication and decision-making skills at this fun statewide contest. The day will include both individual and team competition with classes of beef cattle, Boer goats, sheep and swine.

Contest divisions include:

- 4-H Juniors Ages 8-13 as of January 1
- 4-H Seniors Ages 14-19 as of January 1
- FFA Junior High Youth that recently completed seventh or eighth grade
- FFA High School Youth that recently completed grades 9-12
- MLE Ages 8-21 as of January 1 and not a member of 4-H or FFA
- Cloverbuds Age 7 as of January 1, non-competitive

Raise a puppy. Change a life.

By being a volunteer puppy raiser, you and your family create life-changing moments, while helping a person who is blind or visually impaired regain independence.



WHAT DOES A PUPPY RAISER DO?

- Devote 12-15 months of your time, energy and love to raising a puppy.
- > Provide daily care, such as feeding and walking
- Teach basic commands based on Leader Dog guidelines
- Introduce the puppy to a variety of people and environments
- Receive tons of ongoing support from Leader Dogs for the Blind



There are multiple puppy raising options to fit your lifestyle.

ONE HOUSEHOLD

This traditional way to puppy raise is perfect for families, college students, active singles, retired couples and empty nesters.

CO-RAISING (PRIMARY AND SECONDARY RAISER)

This option is for someone who wants to share duties with a person from another household.



PASS-ALONG

One raiser has the puppy for the first six months and a second raiser has the puppy for the next six months.

- Ideal for people who can commit only to a limited time raising a puppy
- Individuals with pet weight/size restrictions or who may be more comfortable handling a younger, lighter dog can raise for the first six months, while individuals who prefer a dog that already has foundational behaviors may prefer raising the last six months.



CAMPUS PUPPIES

For college students raising on campuses approved by Leader Dog.

- Must participate in campus puppy club and meet with assigned puppy counselor
- All supplies, veterinary care and food paid by Leader Dog
