2024 Kalamazoo County Youth Fair Camping Fees & Information CAMPING RESERVATIONS



The Kalamazoo County Parks & Expo Center will be handling all the camping reservations again this year.

Beginning on May 1, 2024, you must call to make your reservation directly with the Expo Center at 269-383-8778

Camping Fees: Weekly Rate - \$150.00 per week (8/5-8/11)

Reservations made after July 28 are \$180 per week

Advance Reservation Fee: One-time \$5.00 fee will be charged for all advance reservations

Golf Carts: All golf carts must be pre-registered. Golf cart permits are \$25 each. After July 28 fee is

\$100. You must be 18 years of age, have a valid driver's license and provide proof of

liability insurance to operate a golf cart on the grounds.

VEHICLE ADMISSION PASSES ARE REQUIRED FOR ANYONE CAMPING AT THE FAIR.

Passes are \$10. and covers your vehicle and the admission of everyone in the vehicle for the entire Fair.

Septic Service: A dump station with potable water is available on the grounds. On-site septic service

will be available by pre-registration with your camping reservation for \$40 per dump.

Dumps will be scheduled for Thursday, August 8.

Deadline for Camping Registration July 28, 2024

Campground check-in will take place from 9-6pm on Monday, August 5.

No early arrivals.

Camping Information:

- Camping will be reserved by campground area at time of reservation (see map for campground areas) and specific site numbers will be emailed out approximately 1 week prior to arrival. We will try to accommodate special requests. All requests will be considered in order by date of reservation.
- Campers may not switch from assigned site number upon arrival. All reservations must be paid by credit card at the time of reservation. There is a non-refundable \$5 reservation fee for each campsite reserved. Most sites offer water and electric hook-up.
- Showers and handicapped-accessible restrooms are available.
- Cancellations will be accepted until July 28, 2024. Reservation fees are non-refundable. If you cancel your
 reservation by July 28, 2024 your refund will be the camping fees paid less a \$5 cancellation fee. No refunds
 are available for cancellations after July 28, 2024.

Please review your goat project guidelines here: <u>Goat project guidelines</u> Some highlights:

- You must attend at least 2 meetings to show at the fair in August.
 - The all-species meeting DOES count as one of those meetings if you attended.
 - YQCA does NOT count as a project meeting
 - The mandatory livestock meeting before fair does NOT count as a project meeting
- ALL goats coming to the fairgrounds, whether being shown or not, must be identified and have required
 pictures turned in with the registration form by 6/1/24. The form can be found here: Goat Registration
 Form
- Goats not identified are not eligible for exhibiting at fair and will not be allowed to be unloaded at the fairgrounds.

Remember:

Animals may not be shown in more than one 4-H sanctioned fair in a calendar year. But! MLE or other showcases not affiliated with MSU Extension 4-H are acceptable.

 - It is considered the minimum- be creative! There must be an educational element (show something going on in the beef industry, talk about feed products, illness/ treatment that your beef steer could experience, etc.) A profit and loss statement must be filled out and included in your educational exhibit for your calf to be sold in the auction.
- August 5- Calf check in/ Weigh in/ Showmanship clinic: You can check in your steers/calves into the Beef/Feeder Calf barn Monday, August 5- time: TBD- Kyle, Greg or Sara must look at your calf before the calf comes off of the trailer. Feeder calf weigh in will take place after the beef are weighed in.
- We will have a showmanship clinic—time TBD
- August 7- Show day Feeder Calf show will be held at 2 pm; Beef show will be held at 4 pm
- August 8 Pizza party 6 pm; Set up for Auction 6:45pm
- August 9- Auction 10 am

For your calf to be eligible to go through the auction:

- ✓ You must have submitted a picture via Facebook/email/ mail to Kyle, Sara or Greg by earlier in the year
 (per project requirements),
- ✓ A picture of a clean calf/clean 4H member must be given to either Kyle, Sara or Greg on Tuesday of fair (to be given to your buyer), and
- ✓ You must have a profit and loss statement filled out per Project Record Book Requirements.
- ✓ Dairy Feeder Calves must have weigh at least 366.5 lbs on Monday August 5 to go through auction.





Are you curious about daily life, culture, and youth programs in other countries?

Travel abroad with States' 4-H and enter a world that most visitors rarely get to see.

Program Details:

States' 4-H Summer Outbound programs provide American 4-H youth with the opportunity to travel to foreign countries for a month-long cultural immersion experience. Delegates live with volunteer host families* and engage in experiential learning about a new way of life. Delegates experience aspects of daily life that allow them to more deeply understand both their host culture and their own culture. Our network of like-minded international partners recruit host families and plan enrichment activities.

*Exception: Argentina uses group accommodations on program

Japan 8-week: June 12—August 9, 2024
Costa Rica: June 20—July 19, 2024
Argentina: June 20—July 15, 2024
Norway: June 20—July 20, 2022
Japan 4-week: July 10—August 9, 2024

Eligibility:

4-H ages 12—18 for Japan 4-Week & Taiwan, 12—17 for Korea, and 15—18 for Costa Rica, Norway, Argentina, and Japan 8-Week

Program Information:

- Adult chaperones accompany the group during international travel and remain in-country to provide support.
- States' 4-H provides Program Handbooks that cover everything from packing lists to financial matters to cultural information.
- States' 4-H conducts group conference calls and a National Departure Orientation prior to international travel.
- No prior language study is required, but it certainly is helpful!
 Our international partners have English-speaking staff on hand to assist you in communication.



2024 OUTBOUND PROGRAMS

States' 4-H International's mission is to enhance world understanding and global citizenship; one way to move towards that goal is through living with a local host family and immersing oneself in another culture.











Program Fees Include:

Welcome packet; overnight national departure orientation; arrival orientation in host country; portion of chaperone fee; Accident & Sickness Medical Insurance; in-country transportation, lodging, and meals while on-program; country-specific activities as determined by international partner organizations; overnight national departure debriefing upon return.

FAQs:

Q: Will a chaperone accompany the group?

A: Yes! Adult chaperones accompany the group during international travel and remain in-country to provide support during the exchange.

Q: Do I need to speak another language?

A: No prior language study is required, but it is certainly helpful!

Our international partners have English-speaking staff on hand
to assist you in communication.

Q: How will States' 4-H prepare me for my homestay?
A: States' 4-H provides travel handbooks that cover everything from packing lists to financial matters to cultural information. In addition, each state may conduct a spring orientation covering these topics. Delegates also receive details during the States' 4-H group conference call in late spring and a National Departure Orientation the day before the international flight.



Michigan 4-H Youth Code of Conduct

The opportunity to participate in or attend 4-H activities is a privilege. All 4-H participants – youth, families, volunteers, and Extension staff who participate in or attend any activity or event sponsored by the Michigan State University Extension 4-H Youth Development Program are expected to uphold the values of the Michigan 4-H program.



All 4-H youth participants must conduct themselves according to the following standards that apply to all Michigan 4-H programs, including virtual programs, and interactions such as social media and internet engagement:

- 1. Create a Welcoming Environment for All. Encourage everyone to fully participate in 4-H. Recognize that all people have skills and talents that can help others and improve the community. Though we will not always agree, we must disagree respectfully. When we disagree, try to understand why. Our first priority is to create a safe, inclusive space for learning, sharing and collaboration that is welcoming to people from diverse backgrounds, cultures, and perspectives. Diversity includes, but is not limited to race, color, national origin, gender, gender identity, religion, age, height, weight, disability, political beliefs, sexual orientation, marital status, family status or veteran status.
- 2. **Bring Your Best Self.** Conduct yourself in a manner that reflects honesty, integrity, self-control, and self-direction. Accept the results and outcomes of 4-H activities and programs with grace and empathy for other participants. Accept the final opinions of judges and evaluators. Be open to new ideas, suggestions, and opinions of others.
- 3. **Obey the Law.** Obey the laws of the locality, state and nation and Michigan State University and Extension policies and guidelines. Commit no illegal acts. Do not possess, offer to others, or use alcohol, illegal drugs, marijuana, or tobacco products, which include e-pens, e-pipes, e-hookah, e-cigars, JUULs, vapes, vape pens or other electronic nicotine delivery systems. Do not attend 4-H activities under the influence of alcohol or illegal substances. Do not possess or use weapons or firearms except as expressly permitted as part of supervised 4-H shooting sports programming. This includes dangerous or unauthorized materials such as explosives or similar items.
- 4. **Honor Diversity Yours and Others'.** Respect and uphold the rights and dignity of all persons with whom you interact as part of Michigan 4-H.
- 5. **Create a Safe Environment.** Be kind and compassionate toward others. Be considerate and courteous of all persons and their property. Do not carelessly or intentionally harm or intimidate anyone in any way (verbally, mentally, physically, or emotionally). Do not insult, harass, or bully others or engage in other hostile behaviors, including sexual harassment, sexual assault or sexual abuse. Abstain from sexual behavior and intimate physical/sexual contact in either public or private situations at an MSU Extension youth 4-H activity or event.
- 6. **Be a Team Player.** Work cooperatively with all individuals involved in 4-H programs and activities. Be responsive to the reasonable requests of the person in charge such as volunteers and staff. Respect the integrity of the group and the group's decisions.
- 7. **Humane Treatment of Animals.** Treat animals humanely and provide appropriate animal care.
- 8. **Participate Fully.** Participate in and contribute to planned programs, be on time and follow through on assigned tasks/responsibilities in a manner that fosters the safety, well-being, and quality of the educational experience for self and others.

Join the Michigan State Fair 4-H & Youth Virtual Showcase!

MSU Extension is thrilled to partner again in 2024 with the <u>Michigan State Fair</u> on an exciting program for Michigan youth: the Michigan State Fair 4-H & Youth Virtual Showcase. This statewide showcase provides a virtual platform for youth across Michigan to exhibit their work in all project areas and apply for up to \$10,000 in scholarships. Any Michigan youth ages 5-19 is encouraged to participate; 4-H membership is not required.

Registration for this event is now open! The diverse array of <u>classes</u> celebrate all the projects and programs in which youth have developed skill and mastery. This includes livestock and animal showmanship classes, as well as still exhibits, educational projects and more.



There is no cost to participate and youth may engage in as many classes as they wish by <u>submitting project photos and videos</u>. **Be sure to submit your entries by the registration deadline of August 10.** Project evaluation will occur before the start of the Michigan State Fair so that winners can be announced at the event which occurs August 29 – September 2.

Going home: Biosecurity tips for animals that travel off the farm

Animals that are exhibited at the county fair, jackpot shows, and other exhibitions are likely near and dear to their exhibitor's hearts.

<u>Michigan State University Extension</u> offers these biosecurity steps exhibitors can take to protect their show animals and those that were left at home once the event has ended.

- Keep animals that left home separate from animals that did not for a minimum of 14 days. If at all possible, do not allow nose-to-nose contact and provide as much distance between animals.
- Disinfect all buckets, feeders, tools and footwear that left home.
- Throw away any feed or hay that left home.
- Always wear clean clothes and footwear. Boot coverings may be helpful when caring for isolated animals.
- Take care of animals that stayed home from the show first, and animals that were at the show second. Do not go back and forth between animals as this increases the risk of cross-contamination.
- Do not eat or drink in the barn.
- Observe animals daily for signs and symptoms of illness, such as:
 - Obvious pain or discomfort
 - Decrease in appetite and water intake
 - Fever
 - Lethargy
 - · Diarrhea or changes in consistency in manure
 - Discharge from nasal cavity or eyes
 - Overall weakness

Care of animals after traveling is just as critical as their pre-show care. Exhibited animals were exposed to new animal populations and fair-goers, and will typically experience a lot of stress during their time away from home. By practicing these biosecurity steps, you can help keep all of your animals safe and healthy.
