Grand Equestrians Therapeutic Riding Program Needs You! If you love working with horses and children, this could be for you!

Grand Equestrians Therapeutic Riding Program helps children with special needs through therapeutic horseback riding, and there are volunteer opportunities available to help bring in horses on the day of classes, grooming, tacking, and helping children get ready to ride.

Once the rider is mounted, up to three volunteers are needed per horse:

- One or Two side walkers who walk alongside the horse and rider to offer support, and one person who leads the horse.
- Side walkers and horse leaders need to be 14 years old, younger volunteers are able to help with grooming, tacking, assisting with games, etc.



Riders are put through patterns of walking, trotting, reversing, changing directions, and stopping. We also play games on horseback like Egg and Spoon, and Red Light Green Light. The Grand Equestrians riders also show at Fair, which is especially awesome!

It is so rewarding to see the smiles on the kid's faces and see the progress they make! We also sign for community service hours 😊

Grand Equestrians Therapeutic Riding Program Needs Horses! Do you have a gentle horse that needs to be worked but don't have time?

The Livingston County 4-H Grand Equestrian Therapeutic Riding Program helps children with special needs through therapeutic horseback riding and are looking for gentle horses to use for this program that operates out of Fowlerville.

Prospective horses will be tested before being accepted into the program. Horses should be able to tolerate loud noises, sudden movements, and riding double.

We would free lease your horse for 6 weeks in June/July, covering these items:



- Proof of negative Coggins test within 12 months will be required before horse can be tested or used for the program.
- Leased horse will stay at the Wylie Farm during the program dates at no charge to you.
- Leased horse will be fed a 12% sweet feed once a day, turned out on green pasture, and given hay when needed.
- The TRP Committee will purchase Coggins tests and 4-way inoculations for horses taken to Fair for our riders.
- The TRP Committee will pay for one Wormer and one hoof trim for leased horses during the program dates.
- If leased horse needs medical attention while horse is at the Wylie Farm, TRP will call Kern Road Vet and pay for expenses. Owner will be called.

Horse Testing is scheduled for Thursday April 11, 2024 2024 Classes start June 4th and run through July 16th on Tuesdays only from 6:00 p.m. – 9:00 p.m. There will be no class the week of July 4th.
