Cloverbud Spring Break Camp is Back in 2025

We are excited to announce the Livingston County 4-H Cloverbud Spring Break Day Camp is back! The Camp will take place at the Livingston Educational Service Agency from March $25^{th}-27^{th}$ from 9 am -3 pm. This day camp will be STEAM focused for ages 5-7 years old with educational, hands-on activities. Families can select to attend 1, 2, or 3 days of the camp. Cost is \$10 a day and snacks are provided.

This camp is open to families already enrolled in 4-H and non-4-H families who enroll before the first day of camp! Registration is being sent to 4-H families first.



We are also looking for teens between the ages of 13-19 years old who would be interested in volunteering as teen counselors for at least 1 day of camp. Youth must be enrolled in 4-H by the first day of the camp, but if youth have friends not in a 4-H club or currently enrolled, they are still able to volunteer if they enroll before camp starts. This is a great way for teens to gain leadership skills, to work with youth, and a great thing to put on a resume or college application. There will be more opportunities to be interviewed on Levels 1 and 2 in April and May this year. Those dates will be announced when scheduled. Note that achieving Level 1 is a requirement to represent Livingston County at the State 4-H Horse show this August.

The Equine Levels of Achievement Program has 5 levels total; Level 1 knowledge includes tying, leading, grooming, feeding, and tack care. Level 2 focuses on parts of the horse and tack, cooling out, hoof care, and immunizations. You do not need a horse for Levels 1 and 2. Level 3 focuses on demonstrating knowledge of showmanship and riding. Levels 4 and 5 are advanced topics covering first aid and colic care, stable management, and equine careers exploration.

Apply for the Michigan 4-H State Awards!

Michigan 4-H true leaders ages 11 and older have an opportunity to be recognized for the great work they do in 4-H and develop their career skills by completing a state award application. A Michigan 4-H State Award is the highest honor bestowed on a Michigan 4-H member and provides an opportunity to receive recognition for their engagement in rich learning experiences that result in outstanding knowledge and life-skill development.

State award applications are divided into four categories: Mark of Excellence contest (10-11 years), junior state award (12-15 years), senior state award (16-19 years) and group awards (13-19 years). Each application and selection process varies, dependent on the applicant's age.



Seeking outstanding agricultural 4-H volunteers

The Michigan 4-H Foundation is seeking nominations of remarkable agricultural 4-H volunteers for the Michigan Farm Bureau (MFB) 4-H Excellence in Agriculture Award. This award recognizes outstanding 4-H volunteers that have exhibited excellence in 4-H youth education and leadership development in the areas of 4-H beef cattle; dairy cattle; goats; horses; horticulture, crops and soils; poultry; rabbits; sheep; swine; and veterinary science.

Up to five MFB Excellence in Agriculture Award honorees are recognized each year. Selected recipients will be recognized by both Michigan 4-H and MFB. In addition, honorees receive a \$1,000 grant they designate to a 4-H agricultural program of their choice. The award is supported by an endowment with the Michigan 4-H Foundation that was established by MFB.
