The program is named after legendary golf course architect Pete Dye, who designed the awardwinning course at The Ford Field and River Club.

The program has been met with enthusiastic support from the members of the Club and the university programs around the country. Students are selected based on telephone interviews conducted by the Golf Maintenance Department and if selected, receive up to \$4,000 scholarship to be used for educational expenses, rewarded at the completion of the program. \$15/hour wages plus time and a half for OT, free housing on site at Ford, uniforms, golfing privileges, in-shore fishing privileges and every other weekend off makes The Ford Field and River Club a great opportunity.

As soon as the Student Superintendents arrive, the team at Ford Field and River Club starts by identifying areas that the specific individual needs to enhance to become a more viable Assistant Superintendent Candidate for potential employers after graduation.
