Landscaping with Native Plants

Join the Tollgate Garden Volunteers and supporters to learn how to get started with native plant landscaping. Discover how to create a landscape design for your yard using native trees, shrubs, wildflowers, grasses, and ferns. This **Zoom** presentation will include butterfly, pollinator, and bird-friendly gardens and the planning basics to successfully landscape your yard with native species.

Martha Holzheuer is the owner of Nature Niche Nature Gifts and Supplies Store, a nature-focused store on the north side of Midland, Michigan. Martha spent about 15 years working as a landscape ecologist and an environmental consultant, specializing in threatened and endangered species protection and permitting, native plant design, invasive species management, wildlife habitat enhancement, and ecological restoration. Before that, she taught woody plants field labs while earning dual master's degrees in Terrestrial (Forest) Ecology and Landscape Architecture at the School of Natural Resources and Environment at U of M, Ann Arbor. Martha is a certified ecological restoration practitioner, a professional landscape architect, a certified ecologist and arborist.

Martha is a board member with both the Society for Ecological Restoration Midwest-Great Lakes Chapter and the Michigan Wetlands Association. She loves botanizing and gardening with native plants, nature photography and art, and helping people learn about and connect with nature.

PAR Report - Kathryn Fitzpatrick



The official first month of spring is here! Flora and fauna alike are starting to emerge and enjoy the sun. We have established a schedule for spring - PAR Spring Schedule Sign-Up Genius. There are still slots available in March and April to help start transplants, water on weekends, and harden transplants in the greenhouse. We will also be direct sowing collard greens and renovating an additional 4 beds in the garden at the end of the month. This is also the time to clean out the shed and get our tools in order. It will be especially nice to check

out our new tools. We usually need to evict a few mice as well.



We are adding a metal garden table to help us with preparing carrot tape for planting, as well as hosing down and cleaning carrots, turnips, radishes, and kohlrabi. It will also serve as a nice place to cure onions. A wooden bench will be added and along with our purple chairs and umbrella should provide a nice resting spot in the garden. Another great addition will be some fantastic signage graciously prepared for us by Caitlin Splawski and Melanie Fuhrmann. Thank you!
