Fun Facts about November:

- The Anglo-Saxons knew November by two names Wind Monath because the wind would start to chill the bones and Blood Monath, named because the cattle went to slaughter in November.
- Why do we vote in November? Because the farmers did not want to disturb the planting, growing or harvest seasons, so the month of November was chosen as the most logical month for everybody to be able to vote.
- In Finland, the word for November is Marraskuu, meaning the month of the dead. The reason for the name is all the seasonal trees and plants lose their leaves or die in the month of November.

Many generous donations contributed to our bounty this year – pumpkins from Tollgate, surplus harvest from the Edu-Garden, and personal garden contributions. Many thanks!

The PAR Garden team has been outstanding. Their dedication, perseverance, and hard work makes this endeavor not only extremely productive, but very rewarding. The enthusiasm and great ideas continue to make the garden thrive. We had a great end of season potluck lunch (with a delicious assortment of dishes) and planning meeting. We discussed adding herbs as companion plants, and tomatillos to accompany our hot peppers. A decision was made to cover the beds individually and only uncover when it is time to plant to help with minimizing the weed pressure. In addition, we will be submitting a request to add adaptive tools to our inventory to assist those with physical challenges and to help minimize stress on the back, shoulders, elbows, knees, and wrists.



We completed the garden activities in October with a grand finale involving several workdays to take advantage of nicer weather.



Final harvests included root vegetables with potatoes, turnips, and beets.



We also harvested and laid out all the onions to cure and finished by removing the dry tops and roots. Our leeks also turned out great with a good harvest.



Only one crop is planted in the fall – garlic. We have planted three beds and will enjoy the green sprouts in the spring.

Other activities are focused on winterizing the garden – weeding and covering the beds with cardboard and black plastic. We hope this will help us smother most of the weeds.

November and December will be focused on indoor activities – garden layout with crop rotation, seed selection and ordering, budget drafting, and the creation of a schedule for the greenhouse starts. We will be coordinating with the Sustainable Agriculture team to minimize the cost of seeds and seed potatoes by aggregating our needs, as well as collaborating on greenhouse duties.

PB&J and Forgotten Harvest have been wonderful partners, picking up on Monday and Tuesday, and delivering the fresh produce to various centers. PB&J not only provide the produce for the food-challenged in Detroit, but they cook up meals for the homeless for three locations in Detroit. The Monday pickup has also been distributed to the Northville Civic Concern Center which supports over 100 families who are food challenged. Forgotten Harvest focuses on local centers that provide food for the food-challenged in the area, and the pumpkins were delivered to the main distribution center. Their efforts are most appreciated in helping us to reach those in need!

All volunteers, whether Extension Master Gardeners, avid gardeners, or individuals interested in gardening and community service, regardless of experience level, are welcome to join the team once cleared through the MSU Volunteer Selection Process. We have an enthusiastic, fun, hard-working team, and plenty of rewarding opportunities to help those in need. Come check us out.

Tollgate Garden Volunteer Membership Levels

When you renew your TGV membership each year, we ask you to designate your status as an ACTIVE member or a SUPPORTING member. As a reminder, these designations mean the following:

ACTIVE MEMBER: Volunteer in the gardens on workdays or individual assignments, volunteer at events and projects on the site, receive all communication and participate in monthly meetings.

- All active volunteers must go through the MSU Volunteer Selection Process (VSP) screening to work on site and maintain their VSP status yearly or as required by MSU volunteer selection procedure policy.
- Extension Master Gardeners (EMG) are screened through the VSP process either at the start of the program when you take the EMG class or when you renew your EMG certification/VSP update each year or as required by MSUE. If you are an active/current EMG and choose to volunteer at Tollgate your VSP status is complete.
- Previously certified EMGs who decide to let their certification lapse can still volunteer on the site, but still must go through the VSP screening requirement as above. We have onsite personnel who can help you complete the process.
- If you are an active MSU volunteer through another program on site and have maintained an active VSP status, then your VSP status is complete
- Individuals who have not gone through the VSP screening, will need to pursue the VSP screening before they can be an active volunteer at Tollgate (or at any MSU site or program). We have onsite personnel who can help you complete this process.
- Note that once an individual has participated in the initial VSP screening, they need only approve
 a background check in subsequent years. No need to obtain references and other activities that
 are required with the initial VSP screening.

SUPPORTING MEMBER: Support the volunteers and participate in monthly meetings and general activities.

- Notified regarding monthly membership meetings.
- Informed about Tollgate events via the Farm News newsletter and other informative e-mail notifications.
- Supporter status will **not** allow you to participate as a volunteer in the garden maintenance activities, maple syrup project or any MSU Extension events on site.
- Return to an "ACTIVE" status at any time by completing the VSP screening process.

A donation is NOT required to renew your membership. All donations are greatly appreciated and go into our account to maintain the gardens.

What is an AGL?

If you are new to volunteering in the Tollgate gardens, or even if you are a seasoned veteran, you may have heard the term "AGL" in meetings and correspondence and wondered just what that was. The acronym "AGL" stands for Area Garden Leader. In the Tollgate gardens, this is the term we use to designate a person (or persons) who direct the activities in a particular garden and take on the behind-the-scenes organization of information and communications. It is a wonderful way to enhance your gardening skills and creates many opportunities to expand your plant knowledge, learn more about design, and strengthen your project organization skills. Experienced members will be happy to help you transition to this leadership role. Within our group is a wealth of knowledge that is willingly shared. There will be someone available to orient any new AGL on the plants, purpose, and potential of that particular garden area.

Role of AGL: To act as the point person regarding the needs and plans for a designated/chosen garden for communications with team members, the Farm Manager, and the Tollgate Garden Advisory Committee (TGAC).

Responsibilities of AGL:

- Gather, update, and disperse information about the chosen garden, including but not limited to: plant list, plant tags, and the seasonal need of those plants via the garden binders kept in the Volunteer Center, and other formats, such as brochures and the Tollgate Garden Volunteers (TGV) website.
- Communicate garden needs and work activities with other team members and other TGVs on designated assigned work days.
- Communicate any plans or budget needs of the chosen garden in the required format/form and timeline for approval by the TGAC. These can be developed solely or with other team members.

Qualifications:

- "Active" member designation in the TGVs, including having completed the annual Volunteer Selection Process (VSP).
- Eagerness to learn about plants in a designated/chosen garden area.
- Willingness to work with and direct other team members as required. The TGAC will attempt to direct other TGV members with similar interests to join a particular garden team, so that even a solo AGL is not expected to do all the physical work in the gardens.

Each garden has designated Saturday Workdays throughout the gardening season to help keep up basic maintenance. You can work with a garden partner as co-AGL and take on any part or whole garden available.

If you are not yet ready for a lead assignment, please consider joining one of these or an existing team in the many other Tollgate gardens. The annual AGL meeting, open to all interested active TGVs, is held the third Saturday in January. **The 2025 meeting will take place on January 18 at 10:00 am** in the conference center. Attending this meeting would be a great opportunity to learn more about becoming an AGL or garden team member.

Last Workday of the Season Potluck Lunch

On the last Saturday workday of the season, October 26, instead of the usual hotdog lunch, TGV members gathered in the conference center for a potluck. It was a chance for those who couldn't attend the Recognition Dinner to stop and chat with Roy. A fun time was had by all! It was agreed that this might be a fun way to end the workday season in the future.





Recipes for one of the favorite desserts:

Basil-Lime Pound Cake

1 cup sour cream
1 cup sour cream
1 cup sweet basil
1 cup granulated sugar, plus some for the pan
1 cup confectionary sugar
3 large eggs
½ cup butter
½ cup margarine
1 ½ tablespoon lime juice
1 tablespoon lime rind zest
½ teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon vanilla

Mix baking soda with sour cream. Set aside In processor with blades running drop basil down feed tube. Add sugars and process a few minutes longer. Add eggs, butter, margarine, sour cream and baking soda mixture, lime zest, juice, salt and vanilla. Process until smooth, add flour and pulse on/off only until the flour has been mixed well. (Do not over process) grease an angel food or bundt pan. Sprinkle in a little sugar in the pan and tap out any extra sugar. Place batter in prepared pan and bake in 350 degree oven for 1 hour or until done. Cool+10 minutes, then invert cake onto a plate. Spread with Cream Cheese-Lime frosting

Cream Cheese-Lime Icing

4 ounces cream cheese, softened
½ stick butter

1 cup confectionary sugar
1 teaspoon lime rind, grated (green only
1 teaspoon lime juice
½ teaspoon cream of tartar
Blend all ingredients together until smoot
Spread on top of warm (not hot) cake.

2024 Garden Volunteer Year End Report

Activity Summary as of October 2024:

- Tollgate Garden Volunteers (TGV) had a roster of 130 Active volunteers enrolled to work in the gardens and 33 Supporting volunteers also contributing to the success of the horticultural efforts in the Tollgate Gardens.
- The Spring and Fall Plant Sale events were executed successfully with funds raised for the maintenance and development of the Tollgate Demonstration Gardens.
- The ongoing project for signage in the gardens will continue to enhance the educational value of the gardens for the public/visitors and gardeners alike.
- Donated benches and multiple Eagle Scout projects enhanced the garden and volunteer spaces.
- Donated hardscape structure of a bridge and constructed bog with plants and pump, also enhanced the safety, function and beauty of the Children's Garden pond feature.
- Saturday group garden workdays were conducted throughout the season. There was participation
 of a community youth group for work activity in the PAR garden and a corporate group from Atain.
 Scheduled garden volunteer opportunities for 2024 continue through early November.
- The annual Pancake Breakfast was held in April open to all TGV, Maple Syrup project team and visiting new volunteer candidates with good attendance.
- The Garden Open House event was held in July as scheduled. An estimated 200 guests enjoyed tours and educational talks were given by the TGV. The evening was a success with good visitor feedback.
- January through March TGV meetings were done via Zoom with return of in-person done on site April-October (excludes July which is open House event). This combination of presentation types continues to help in connectivity of members and continued quality of monthly speakers.
- TGV provided garden maintenance, garden planning, food production, and many other essential garden tasks to enhance the presentation of the Tollgate Gardens and Plant-A-Row for the Hungry to benefit the residents of Oakland County and beyond.

Garden Volunteer data:

- As of 10/24/2024 recorded hours on the Tollgate sign in system or gathered manually shows 105
 Tollgate Garden Volunteers, youth and community volunteers in the gardens and special projects.
- Total hours for garden volunteers: 3013.5 hours for the Jan 1-Oct 24 reporting period of the 2024 season. Hours in this total included the Nursery volunteers 123.5, PAR volunteers 453.5, special garden events (open house, plant sale) and Pumpkinfest 132, Maple Syrup team 185, garden volunteers 2033.25 hours. Miscellaneous, general, or administrative hours 86.25. Another 150 hours estimated from community volunteers not using the hours recording system.
- Volunteers working in MSU Tollgate's Plant-A-Row for the hungry garden produced 3,953 lbs. of food for Forgotten Harvest and PB&J in Detroit. This team continues to assess and adjust planting plans for best utilized produce for donation to organizations such as Forgotten Harvest.
- The current estimated national value of volunteer time based on the 2024 independent sector.org \$33.49/hr., with a total estimated value provided by TGV of \$100,922 for 2024 season.
- Tollgate Garden Volunteer Plant sales generated over \$13,400 in revenue for the maintenance of the Tollgate Demonstration Gardens to offset the garden expenses this season.




