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Update on Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI) Restrictions

We wanted to update our 4-H families on HPAI. There have been several additional detections of HPAI in dairy herds. As of today, the most recent detection was announced on May 28th. This means exhibition of lactating dairy cattle and those in the last two months of their pregnancy is prohibited until July 28th. This means we will not have lactating dairy cattle and those in the last two months of pregnancy at the Youth Show. Youth in these project areas can still participate and alternatives are being developed and will soon be shared.

As of today, the last detection of HPAI in poultry remains May 9th, which means exhibition of poultry shows is prohibited until June 9th. This means we may still be able to have poultry at the Youth Show, but this could change if there is another detection.

Still Project Judges, Clerks, and Runners Needed

Every club with member(s) participating in Still Projects of any type (Dept 60 and higher) is **required** to provide at least one full shift clerk or runner or at least two half shift clerks or runners to assist with judging. Remember, the 4-H Youth Show can't happen without YOU! Clerks and runners are needed Sunday, July 21st, 12:30 PM-4:30 PM in Building B (Open Pavilion). Clerk Orientation MUST be completed prior to this time either in person at the Youth Show or with our Still Project Superintendents before hand. Clerks and runners can be **anyone** who



meets the age requirements— 4-H members, parents, leaders, alumni, grandparents, friends, etc. Check out the <u>Sign Up Form</u> for more information on the roles and age requirements. You can write your own invitation and personally talk to people, but we also have paper copies of a generic buyer letter at the MSU Extension Office. How to Thank a 4-H Auction Buyer

Many of our 4-H families like to thank their buyers in various ways at or after the Washtenaw County 4-H Auction. We encourage 4-H'ers to acknowledge their buyer with a thank you card and photo of their animal (you can find thank you cards and photos at the 4-H Office in Building A on Friday). There are no rules or policies about how you thank your buyer, but it is recommended that families do their best not to disrupt the auction by presenting gifts during this time. If you would like to present a gift, please wait until after the auction or if a business bought from you, drop it off at their



location at a later date. A well written thank you card, and photograph goes a long way to make your buyer feel appreciated. One of the best ways to know if you buyer appreciates the gesture is if they support you in the future!

The Michigan 4-H and FFA State Livestock Judging Contest is returning this year at a new date! Participants can demonstrate their livestock evaluation and selection skills, as well as improve their communication and decision-making skills at this fun statewide contest. The day will include both individual and team competition with classes of beef cattle, Boer goats, sheep and swine.

- 4-H Juniors Ages 8-13 as of January 1
- 4-H Seniors Ages 14-19 as of January 1
- FFA Junior High Youth that recently completed seventh or eighth grade
- FFA High School Youth that recently completed grades 9-12
- MLE Ages 8-21 as of January 1 and not a member of 4-H or FFA
- Cloverbuds Age 7 as of January 1, non-competitive

Building Early Emotional Skills

Are you having trouble with biting, tantrums or the "terrible twos?" Building Early Emotional Skills (BEES) is a four-week class for primary caregivers of children 0-3 that teaches about how young children develop social emotional skills and helps give caregivers skills to deal with the stress of caring for children and to help their children develop strong social emotional skills. BEES will help you learn about your child's temperament and stress, your triggers and how to manage them, being reflective about feelings and emotion coaching, reducing biting, conflict and frustration, handling tantrums, and building a solid foundation for tomorrow.
